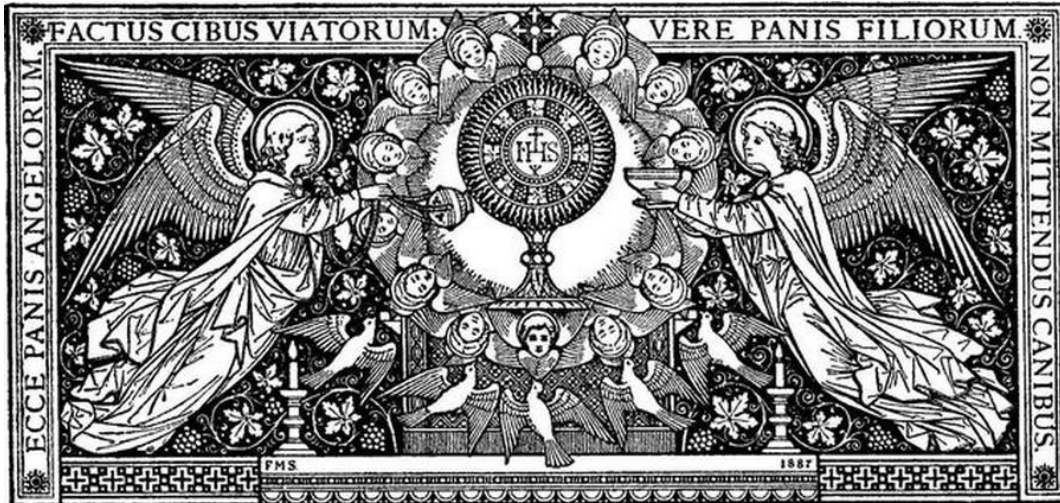

Solemnity of Corpus Christi

Dear faithful,

The procession is one of the great acts of Catholic piety and a public profession of our faith. Let us take this opportunity to express proudly our belief in Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. We can hope that clement weather will make it possible!

Though Paschal time has ended, the liturgical calendar remains quite eventful! The entire month of June, as you may know, is consecrate to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This Friday, we celebrate the feast itself, which we will solemnize again on the coming Sunday.

June also contains the feast of the Nativity of the great Forerunner and Prophet of our Lord, Saint John the Baptist, which falls on the 24th, six months before Christmas. The 29th June is the feast of Ss. Peter and Paul, co-patrons of our beloved church. This day emphasises in particular the martyrdom of St. Peter, while a special commemoration of St. Paul is celebrated on the 30th.

✠ **First Communions for children:** Congratulations to Pippa and Kairo who are making their first Communion today! May they always remain close to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

✠ **Second Collection for the Sister Adorers:** Next week, [Sunday, 14th June](#), we will receive donations at the end of Mass for the support of the feminine branch of our Institute, the Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus. We thank you in advance for your generosity!

✠ **Adult Catechism Class – “The Catholic Moral Life”:** The next (and final) class before the summer will be held on [Saturday, 13th June at 11am](#). In this conference, we will learn about the Catholic teaching on conscience and also learn one of the methods of examining the conscience.

✠ **Reduced schedule during the summer months:** Dear faithful, please note carefully that there will be a slight reduction in services during the summer months, since only one priest will be present.

On Sunday evenings throughout the summer, there will be no Vespers or Compline. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 4.30 followed by rosary and benediction.

On Saturday morning, there will be no adoration. Confession will be offered from 9.20am - 9.50am prior to the Mass. [Beginning the week of 8th June](#), there will be no adoration, confession or Mass on **Monday and Thursday** at the Dome. As always, the church will be open during the day for private prayer.

The full liturgical schedule of services will be resumed in September, following the General Chapter of the ICKSP.

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament

Throughout the summer, we will continue to have Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. The rite begins with exposition (placing the monstrance with a Sacred Host on the altar for adoration) during which a hymn or antiphon is sung. At the end, there are three additional prayers which we say at the Dome: The daily consecration of the ICKSP to the Immaculate Conception, the August Queen of Heaven, and the Prayer for England. For those who are unfamiliar with these prayers, I have made little A4 booklets at the back of the church so that you may now follow along.

On Sunday evenings through the summer, there will be one half hour of silent adoration from 4.30 – 5.00 pm, followed by the recitation of the Holy Rosary and Benediction.

PROPERS FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

INTROIT *Psalm 80. 17, 2*

He fed them with the fat of corn, alleluia, and filled them with honey out of the rock, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. Rejoice to God our helper; sing aloud to the God of Jacob. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O God, Who in this wonderful sacrament has left us a memorial of Thy passion: grant us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate the sacred mysteries of Thy Body and Blood, that we may ever perceive within us the fruit of Thy redemption. Who livest.

EPISTLE *1 Corinthians 11. 23-29*

Brethren, I have received of the Lord, that which also I delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and giving thanks, broke, and said: Take ye and eat, this is My Body which shall be delivered for you; this do for the commemoration of Me. In like manner also the chalice, after He had supped, saying: This chalice is the new testament in My Blood; this do ye, as often as you shall drink, for the commemoration of Me. For as often as you shall eat this bread and drink this chalice, you shall show the death of the Lord until He come. Therefore whosoever shall eat this bread, or drink of the chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the Body and the Blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself; and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of the chalice. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh judgment to himself, not discerning the Body of the Lord.

GRADUAL *Psalm 144. 15-16*

The eyes of all hope in Thee, O Lord, and Thou givest them meat in due season. V. Thou openest Thy hand, and fillest every living creature with Thy blessing.

ALLELUIA *John 6. 56-57*

Alleluia, alleluia. V. My Flesh is meat indeed, and My Blood is drink indeed: he that eateth My Flesh and drinketh My Blood, abideth in Me, and I in him. Alleluia

SEQUENCE - Lauda Sion

Sion, lift thy voice and sing: Praise thy Savior and thy King; Praise with hymns thy Shepherd true:

Dare thy most to praise Him well; For He doth all praise excel; None can ever reach His due.

Special theme of praise is thine, That true living Bread divine, That life-giving flesh adored, Which the brethren twelve received, As most faithfully believed, At the Supper of the Lord.

Let the chant be loud and high; Sweet and tranquil be the joy felt to-day in every breast; On this festival divine Which recounts the origin Of the glorious Eucharist.

At this table of the King, Our new Paschal offering Brings to end the olden rite; Here, for empty shadows fled, Is reality instead; Here, instead of darkness, light.

His own act, at supper seated, Christ ordained to be repeated, In His memory divine; Wherefore now, with adoration, We the Host of our salvation Consecrate from bread and wine.

Hear what holy Church maintaineth, That the bread its substance changeth Into Flesh, the wine to Blood.

Doth it pass thy comprehending? Faith, the law of sight transcending, Leaps to things not understood.

Here in outward signs are hidden Priceless things, to sense forbidden; Signs, not things, are all we see:-

Flesh from bread, and Blood from wine; Yet is Christ, in either sign, All entire confessed to be (...)

GOSPEL *John 6. 56-59*

At that time Jesus said to the multitudes of the Jews: My Flesh is meat indeed, and My Blood is drink indeed. He that eateth My Flesh, and drinketh My Blood, abideth in Me, and I in him. As the living Father hath sent Me, and I live by the Father, so he that eateth Me, the same also shall live by Me. This is the bread that came down from Heaven. Not as your fathers did eat manna and are dead. He that eateth this Bread shall live for ever.

OFFERTORY *Leviticus 21. 6*

The priests of the Lord offer incense and loaves to God, and therefore they shall be holy to their God, and shall not defile His name. Alleluia.

SECRET

We beseech Thee, O Lord, mercifully grant to Thy Church the gifts of unity and peace, which are mystically shown forth in the offerings now made. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION *1 Corinthians 11. 26-27*

As often as you shall eat this Bread and drink the Chalice, you shall show the death of the Lord until He come: therefore who soever shall eat this Bread or drink the Chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the Body and Blood of the Lord. Alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION

Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be filled with the everlasting enjoyment of Thy divinity which is prefigured by the reception in this life of Thy precious Body and Blood: Who livest.
