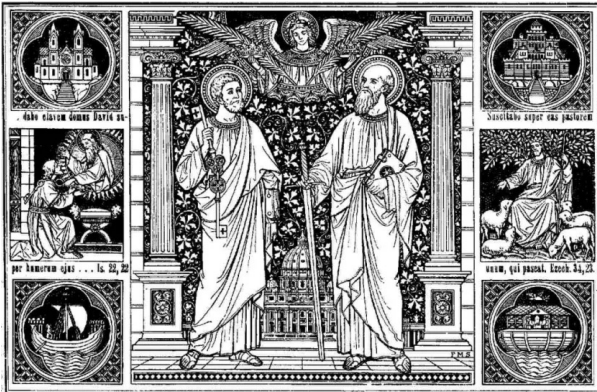

Solemnity of Ss. Peter & Paul

Dear faithful,

Saint Paul exclaims to the Ephesians, “You are fellow citizens with the saints, and the domestics of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone” (5.19-20). St. John Chrysostom, in a famous sermon, remarks that many Christians know the entire roster of sports teams but cannot name the 12 apostles. Let us use the occasion of this festivity to draw closer to these men whom our Lord chose to lead His Church, and to seek earnestly their intercession.

✠ **Note on blessings after Sunday Mass:** The time after Sunday Mass is a privileged moment for the priest to encounter the faithful, many of whom he does not have the opportunity to speak with during the week. Therefore, while there is only one priest present at the Dome, the blessing of sacramentals will be limited to the prayer *ad omnia* from the ritual given once for all items of piety, until further notice. Special blessings and enrolments will be given on particular feast days or when arranged directly with the priest ahead of time.

✠ **Mass on Monday, 29th June:** There **WILL** be Mass this Monday evening. While there are normally no services on Monday evening for the duration of the summer schedule, Adoration, Confessions and the Low Mass will be at their usual times because it is our patronal feast. The Sung Mass, however, will only be celebrated this Sunday during the Solemnity.

✠ **Ordinations of the ICKSP in Florence, Italy.** Monday 29th June, incardination of future deacons and reception of the cassock by first-year seminarians. to Thursday, 2nd July, young men will be ordained to all seven of the priestly orders. First Masses of our four new priests will be celebrated on Friday, 3rd July (Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart for 1st Friday). Please keep all of our seminarians in your prayers and ask Our Lord for new vocations. *Lord, grant us priests!*

✠ **Publication of the Banns:** Miss Janise Angela Robson and Mr. Vincent Lee Williams are scheduled to be united in holy matrimony at the Dome on Saturday, 11th July. In accordance with traditional practice of the ‘Banns’, anyone who would be aware of an impediment to the marriage is bound to notify the Rector of Ss. Peter & Paul and St. Philomena.

✠ **Sacrament of Holy Matrimony:** Couples desiring to marry should approach a priest at least six months prior to the wedding date. They should also regularly attend Sunday Mass at the Dome.

✠ **Welcome to baby Maria Rose Wallace,** daughter of Adam and Bernadette, who was christened last Saturday at the Dome! May God and Our Lady watch over her!

✠ **Reduced schedule during the summer months:** Dear faithful, please note carefully that there will be a slight reduction in services during the summer months, since only one priest will be present.

On Sunday evenings throughout the summer, there will be no Vespers or Compline. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 4.30 followed by rosary and benediction.

On Saturday morning, there will be no adoration. Confession will be offered from 9.20am - 9.50am prior to the Mass. There will be no adoration, confession or Mass on **Monday and Thursday** at the Dome (note: please see the newsletter for exceptions on Holy Days). As always, the church will be open during the day for private prayer.

The full liturgical schedule of services will be resumed in September, following the General Chapter of the ICKSP.

Statement on the re-introduction of the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill

Archbishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues for the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, has expressed his deep disappointment that the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill will return to parliament in autumn: I am deeply disappointed that the previously unsuccessful Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill is being reintroduced in the House of Commons. It is likely to be debated in September. The Catholic Church opposes this Bill in principle and joins with many other people of faith and none in arguing that we should not cross this watershed. [...] Concerns that were raised remain unresolved. The Bill undermines freedom of conscience for medical professionals and care workers. It also requires care homes and hospices to participate in assisted suicide, threatening not only their

future existence but also the wellbeing of their more vulnerable staff. Reintroducing this legislation, once again, places the most vulnerable at risk. I ask MPs to reject this Bill.

Recent debates have exposed the uneven provision of palliative care across the country. Surely what is now needed to help the terminally ill is an improvement in compassionate, high-quality palliative care, and proper hospice funding, especially for those living with terminal illness.

Finally, I call on all people of goodwill to join me in work and prayer to prevent this flawed bill from succeeding.

Solemnity of the Holy Apostles Ss. Peter & Paul

INTROIT *Acts 12. 11*

Now I know in very deed, that the Lord hath sent His angel, and hath delivered me out of the hand of Herod, and from all the expectation of the people of the Jews. *Ps.* Lord, Thou hast proved me and known me: Thou hast known my sitting down and my rising up. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O God, who hast made holy this day with the martyrdom of Thine apostles Peter and Paul; grant that Thy Church may in all things follow the precepts of those from whom it first received the faith. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE *Acts 12. 1-11*

In those days, Herod the king stretched forth his hand to afflict some of the Church: and he killed James, the brother of John, with the sword; and seeing that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to take up Peter also. Now it was in the days of the azymes: and when he had apprehended him, he cast him into prison, delivering him to four files of soldiers to be kept, intending after the Pasch to bring him forth to the people. Peter therefore was kept in prison; but prayer was made without ceasing by the Church unto God for him. And when Herod would have brought him forth, the same night Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains; and the keepers before the door kept the prison. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood by him, and a light shined in the room; and he striking Peter on the side, raised him up, saying: Arise quickly. And the chains fell off from his hands; and the angel said to him: Gird thyself, and put on thy sandals. And he did so. And he said to him: Cast thy garment about thee, and follow me. And going out, he followed him: and he knew not that it was true which was done by the angel; but he thought he saw a vision. And passing through the first and the second ward, they came to the iron gate that leadeth to the city, which of itself opened to them; and going out, they passed on through one street, and immediately the angel departed from him. And Peter coming to himself, said: Now I know in very deed that the Lord hath sent His angel, and hath delivered me out of the hand of Herod, and from all the expectation of the people of the Jews.

GOSPEL *Matthew 16. 13-19*

At that time, Jesus came into the quarters of Caesarea Philippi, and He asked His disciples, saying: Whom do men say that the Son of man is? PREFACE OF THE APOSTLES

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, humbly to pray Thee, O Lord, the eternal Shepherd, to abandon not Thy flock; but through Thy blessed Apostles to keep a continual watch over it; that it may be governed by those same rulers whom Thou didst set over it as Thy shepherds and vicars.
