## Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

“Rightly then,” continues Saint Ambrose, “the seventh Beatitude is that of the peaceful; to them belong the seven baskets of the crumbs that were over and above. This bread of the Sabbath, this sanctified bread, this bread of rest,—yes, it is something great; and I even venture to say, that if, after thou hast eaten also of the seven, thou hast no bread on earth that thou canst look forward to.”

But, take notice of the condition specified in our Gospel, as necessary for those who aspire to such nourishment as that. “It is not,” says the Saint, “to lazy people, nor to them that live in cities, nor to them that are great in worldly honors, but to them that seek Christ in the desert, that is given the heavenly nourishment: they only who hunger after it, are

received by Christ into a participation of the World and of God’s kingdom.” The more intense their hunger, the more they long for their divine object and for no other, the more will the heavenly food strengthen them with light and love, the more will it satiate them with delight... *from the Liturgical Year, by Dom Prosper Gueranger.*

✠ **Weekday Masses cancelled:** Due to an absence of priests, there will be no evening Mass at the Dome from this **Monday, 6<sup>th</sup> July through Thursday, 9<sup>th</sup> July.** The 6.30pm Mass will be resumed on **Friday, 10<sup>th</sup> July.** From Monday to Thursday, the church will nevertheless be opened during the day for private prayer.

✠ **Wedding on Saturday:** Miss Janise Angela Robson and Mr. Vincent Lee Williams are schedule to be united in holy matrimony at the Dome on **Saturday, 11<sup>th</sup> July at 3pm.** Congratulations Jan and Vincent!

✠ **Elizabeth Shields, RIP:** Elizabeth, beloved wife of Michael Shields, died on Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> June, having received the Sacraments of Holy Mother Church. Elizabeth was among our candidates who were received into the Catholic Church at the Dome this December past. *Eternal rest grant unto her O Lord! And let perpetual light shine upon her!*

✠ **Note on blessings after Sunday Mass:** The time after Sunday Mass is a privileged moment for the priest to encounter the faithful, many of whom he does not have the opportunity to speak with during the week. Therefore, while there is only one priest present at the Dome, the blessing of sacramentals will be limited to the prayer *ad omnia* from the ritual given once for all items of piety, until further notice. Special blessings and enrolments will be given on particular feast days or when arranged directly with the priest ahead of time.

✠ **Reduced schedule during the summer months:** Dear faithful, please note carefully that there will be a slight reduction in services during the summer months, since only one priest will be present.

**On Sunday evenings** throughout the summer, there will be no Vespers or Compline. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 4.30 followed by rosary and benediction.

**On Saturday morning,** there will be no adoration. Confession will be offered from 9.20am - 9.50am prior to the Mass. There will be no adoration, confession or Mass on **Monday and Thursday** at the Dome (note: please see the newsletter for exceptions on Holy Days). As always, the church will be open during the day for private prayer.

The full liturgical schedule of services will be resumed in September, following the General Chapter of the ICKSP.

### 7 things to know about the beautiful Saint Maria Goretti, Model Of Chastity & Forgiveness

Saint Maria Goretti is a miraculous intercessor with a compelling story. She provides a timeless example of faith, chastity, and forgiveness. The Catholic Church celebrates Saint Maria Goretti's feast day on July 6. Here are seven things to know and share about Saint Maria Goretti:

1. Saint Maria Goretti was born in 1890 in Corinaldo, Italy. She was raised in a poor agricultural family. She was known for her cheerful and devout nature.
2. Maria's father died when she was young, and her mother worked to support their six children. Maria took care of the younger children while her mother worked.

She prayed the Rosary every night for the repose of her father's soul.

3. Maria Goretti died a martyr at age 11. On July 5, 1902, a neighbor named Alessandro Serenelli attempted to sexually assault her. She resisted, proclaiming that it was a sin and an offense against God. Alessandro stabbed her multiple times, resulting in her death the following day.

4. Maria forgave her assailant before she died, expressing her desire to see him in heaven...

INTROIT *Psalm. 27. 8, 9*

The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance, and rule them for ever. Ps. Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. V. Glory be to the Father.

O God of hosts, to Whom all that is best belong, graft in our hearts the love of Thy name, and grant us an increase of true religion: that Thou mayest foster what is good, and with tender zeal guard what Thou hast fostered. Through our Lord

EPISTLE *Romans 6. 3-11*

Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His Resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin, He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God; in Christ Jesus our Lord..

ALLELUIA *Psalm 30, 2-3*

Alleluia, alleluia. V. In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me: bow down Thine ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Mark 8. 1-91*

At that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and they had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.

PREFACE OF THE HOLY TRINITY and SANCTUS

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God; Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son, and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what we believe by Thy revelation of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation. So that in confessing the true and everlasting Godhead, distinction in persons, unity in essence, and equality in majesty may be adored. Which the Angels and Archangels, the Cherubim also and Seraphim do praise: who cease not daily to cry out, with one voice saying:
