Saint Anne

revered as the mother of the Virgin Mary and grandmother of Jesus Christ, is a significant figure in Christian tradition. Her life is primarily known through apocryphal texts, notably the *Protevangelium of James*, which recounts her miraculous conception of Mary. Saint Anne is celebrated for her piety and dedication, with her feast day observed on July 26 in the Roman Catholic Church.

Saint Anne's life and legacy are deeply rooted in Christian tradition, particularly within the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches. Although not mentioned in the canonical Gospels, her story is preserved in apocryphal writings, such as the *Protevangelium of James*, dating back to the 2nd century. According to these texts, Anne and her husband Joachim were devout individuals

from Nazareth who faced the sorrow of childlessness. In their advanced years, they prayed earnestly for a child, and their prayers were answered with the birth of Mary. In gratitude, Anne dedicated her daughter to the service of God, leading to Mary's presentation at the Temple in Jerusalem at the age of three.

This narrative parallels the Old Testament story of Hannah, the mother of the prophet Samuel, highlighting themes of faith and divine intervention. Saint Anne's role as the mother of Mary and grandmother of Jesus underscores her importance in the Holy Family.

INTROIT

Behold, God is my helper, and the Lord is the protector of my soul: turn back the evils upon mine enemies, and cut them off in Thy truth, O Lord my protector. *Ps.* Save me, O God, by Thy name, and deliver me in Thy strength. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Let Thy merciful ears, O Lord, be open to the prayers of Thy suppliant people; and that Thou mayest grant them their petitions, make them to ask such things as shall please Thee. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE *Corinthians 10. 6-13*

Brethren, let us not covet evil things, as they also coveted. Neither become ye idolaters, as some of them: as it is written: The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play. Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed fornication, and there fell in one day three and twenty thousand. Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them tempted, and perished by the serpents. Neither do you murmur, as some of them murmured, and were destroyed by the destroyer. Now all these things happened to them in figure, and they are written for our correction, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore he that thinketh himself to stand, let him take heed lest he fall. Let no temptation take hold on you, but such as is human: and God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that which you are able; but will make also with temptation issue, that you may be able to bear it.
