LITURGY CORNER

What is a 'transferred feast'?

The interplay between the *temporal cycle* (moveable feasts and seasons, depending on the date of Easter) and the *sanctoral cycle* (feasts on set calendar dates) means that the Church's liturgical calendar can sometimes appear mysterious. When the two cycles overlap, how do we know which liturgical celebration (technically called an *office*, including the Divine Office and Mass of the day) will be observed? This overlapping of two different offices is called *occurrence*. When two different offices occur on the same day (for example a feast from the sanctoral and a feast or important feria from the temporal), there are four possible outcomes: the occurring feast will be either *celebrated*, or *commemorated* (by having its Collect included at Lauds, Mass and Vespers, after that of the main office being celebrated), or *omitted* that year, or *transferred* to the first free day. The outcome depends on the relative rank and importance of the two occurring offices. For example, all of the days of Holy Week and Easter Week (the octave of Easter) are highly privileged and so the office of the day must always be held during those two weeks: minor feasts from the sanctoral that fall during that time will simply be omitted. On the other hand, very important feasts, such as the feast of the Annunciation (a first-class feast), cannot simply be omitted, so they are transferred to the first free day after the end of the Easter octave. This year the Annunciation (25th March) fell on Good Friday: it is therefore transferred to the Monday after Low Sunday. The feast of St. Benedict (21st March) is a minor feast in the universal Church and so it would normally be omitted when falling in Holy Week but in the Institute it is kept as a first-class feast (patron saint) and so we transfer it after Low Sunday. Although St. Benedict falls before the Annunciation in the sanctoral calendar, a feast of Our Lady outranks the feast of a saint, so the Annunciation is transferred to the *first* free day, and St. Benedict is transferred to the *second* free day. Thankfully, the laity do not need to worry about the rules for commemorating or transferring feasts: these are figured out in the yearly liturgical calendar called the Ordo!
