Dearly beloved faithful,

Lent begins this week: what a grace to engage together in this great spiritual retreat that prepares us for Easter! Allow me remind you of the three main pillars of our Lent: Fasting, Prayer and Almsgiving. Since Lent is also a time of sharing and generosity, I would like to share with you some of our ordinary expenses that the Sunday collections do not sufficiently cover.

The recent Spire at Night events raised $\pounds 3,256.21$ towards the cost of restoring our beautiful Rose Window. Whilst this may seem a substantial sum of money, the everyday costs for the church and presbytery have rocketed in recent months, just as they have for everyone.

Just to give a few examples of the current <u>monthly</u> costs for St Walburge's:

Church & Presbytery insurance: £205 Church electricity: £595 Presbytery electricity: £515

Presbytery gas: $\pounds 1265$ – for hot water, and heating only 4 hours per day

Parish hall gas: $\pounds 434$ – for heating only when the hall is in use e.g. for refreshments after Mass & Guild Sundays.

We would like to thank you for the generous support already given to our community while entrusting ourselves to your future consideration, and of course, to the intercession of Saint Joseph!

TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL Quinquagesima Sunday

Lesson from the first letter of St. Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians 1 Cor. 13:1-13

Brethren: If I should speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have charity, I have become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal. And if I have prophecy and know all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains, yet do not have charity, I am nothing. And if I distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I deliver my body to be burned, yet do not have charity, it profits me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind; charity does not envy, is not pretentious, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, is not self-seeking, is not provoked; thinks no evil, does not rejoice over wickedness, but rejoices with the truth; bears with all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Charity never fails, whereas prophecies will disappear, and tongues will cease, and knowledge will be destroyed. For we know in part and we prophesy in part; but when that which is perfect has come, that which is imperfect will be done away with. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I felt as a child, I thought as a child. Now that I have become a man, I have put away the things of a child. We see now through a mirror in an obscure manner, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know even as I have been known. So there abide faith, hope and charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.

Continuation ₮ of the Holy Gospel according to Luke Luke 18:31-43

At that time, Jesus taking to Himself the Twelve said to them, Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and all things that have been written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be delivered to the Gentiles, and will be mocked and scourged and spit upon; and after they have scourged Him, they will put Him to death; and on the third day He will rise again. And they understood none of these things and this saying was hidden from them, neither did they get to know the things that were being said. Now it came to pass as He drew near to Jericho, that a certain blind man was sitting by the wayside, begging; but hearing a crowd passing by, he inquired what this might be. And they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying, Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me! And they who went in front angrily tried to silence him. But he cried out all the louder, Son of David, have mercy on me! Then Jesus stopped and commanded that he should be brought to Him. And when he drew near, He asked him, saying, What would you have Me do for you? And he said, Lord, that I may see. And Jesus said to him, Receive your sight, your faith has saved you. And at once he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people upon seeing it gave praise to God.

Lenten fast and abstinence: Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday. Abstinence refers to refraining from eating any animal meat during the day. Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting is defined as limiting oneself to one full meal per day and two "collations" which, taken together, do not equal another full meal. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are mandatory fast days under current Church law. Everyone over 14 years old is bound to abstinence; adults are bound to the law of fast up to the age of 60. Those who are prevented from fasting by <u>serious</u> health concerns are also dispensed.

<u>40 Hours Adoration</u>: From Sunday 19th at 6pm to Tuesday 21st at 7:15pm. Please register at the rear of the church.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u>: Join us for this traditional Lenten devotion every Friday at 6pm! A confessor will be available during the stations.

<u>Saint Joseph Masses</u>: Beginning on the 19th of February, a series of 30 Masses will be celebrated for our *natural and spiritual fathers*, both living and deceased. For those who would like to participate, please submit your list of intentions to Canon Post along with a donation. The intentions will be entrusted to Saint Joseph. The donations collected will go toward the expenses of candidate formation, in order to help prepare a new generation of spiritual fathers!
