Dear faithful,

Sometimes we have school visits to Saint Walburge's. Inevitably, an object of great fascination is the skull in the sacristy, "Whose is it?!?" the children ask. In fact, we do not know.

However, it was a common practice in the past for Christians to keep a skull (or a depiction of one) as a "Memento Mori" --remembrance of death. Death is the most frightening thing we face in the human condition, so to look at it soberly gives us strength and courage, as well as a a greater appreciation for the gift of life. The meditation on the last things--death, judgement, heaven and hell--also keeps us spiritually grounded and aware of the moral importance of our acts before God.

Let us pray for the poor souls in purgatory, believing in the power of the communion of the saints. When they reach heaven, they will certainly assist us in our journey to join them. On the next page, I have included Psalm 129 (130) "De Profundis", which is a traditional prayer for the dead. Remember that it is also possible to receive a plenary indulgence for the dead between 1st-8th November by visiting a grave or cemetery and praying for the poor souls.

Next Sunday will be the annual Remembrance Sunday Solemn Requiem at our War Memorial altar. In the meantime, I will be on retreat this week at our Sisters' convent of Maria Engelport in Germany. My phone will be turned off, so please don't be offended if I do not respond to messages! You will be in my prayers.

## TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost

## Lesson from the letter of St. Paul the Apostle to the Philippians Phil 3:17-21; 4:1-3

Brethren: Be imitators of me, and mark those who walk after the pattern you have in us. For many walk, of whom I have told you often and now tell you even weeping, that they are enemies of the Cross of Christ. Their end is ruin, their god is the belly, their glory is in their shame, they mind the things of earth. But our citizenship is in heaven from which also we eagerly await a Saviour, our Lord Jesus Christ, Who will refashion the body of our lowliness, conforming it to the body of His glory by exerting the power by which He is able also to subject all things to Himself. So then, my brethren, beloved and longed for, my joy and my crown, stand fast thus in the Lord, beloved. I entreat Evodia and I exhort Syntyche to be of one mind in the Lord. And I beseech you also, my loyal comrade, help them, for they have toiled with me in the gospel, as have Clement and the rest of my fellow-workers whose names are in the book of life.

## Continuation ₱ of the Holy Gospel according to Matthew Matt 9:18-26

At that time, as Jesus was speaking to the crowds, behold, a ruler came up and worshipped Him, saying, "Lord, my daughter has just now died; but come and lay Your hand upon her, and she will return to life." And Jesus arose and followed him, and so did His disciples. Now a woman who for twelve years had been suffering from hemorrhage, came up behind him and touched the tassel of His cloak saying to herself, "If I touch but His cloak I shall be saved." But Jesus, turning and seeing her, said, "Take courage, daughter; your faith has saved you." And the woman was restored to health from that moment. And when Jesus came to the ruler's house, and saw the flute players and the crowd making a din, He said, "Begone, the girl is asleep, not dead." And they laughed Him to scorn.
