Dearly Beloved in Christ,

"I tell you the truth: it is expedient to you that I go: for if I go not, the Paraclete will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you."

The words of Our Lord in the Gospel are surprising, but comforting. The coming physical departure of the Risen Jesus in His Ascension is for our good! Taking away from us one form of His presence enables others. God will dwell within us Institute of Christ the King/St Walburge by His Spirit. He will also dwell with us through the Real Presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

> So often this lesson can be applied to other areas of our lives. The Apostles must have been frightened to hear that Jesus was leaving, but we know that after Pentecost, they showed greater strength than ever before.

### TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL Fourth Sunday after Easter

# Lesson from the letter of St. James the Apostle Jas 1:17-21

Dearly beloved: Every best gift, and every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no change, nor shadow of alteration. For of his own will hath he begotten us by the word of truth, that we might be some beginning of his creatures. You know, my dearest brethren. And let every man be swift to hear, but slow to speak, and slow to anger. For the anger of man worketh not the justice of God. Wherefore casting away all uncleanness, and abundance of naughtiness, with meekness receive the ingrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

At that time: Jesus said to His disciples: I go to him that sent me, and none of you asketh me: Whither goest thou? But because I have spoken these things to you, sorrow hath filled


your heart. But I tell you the truth: it is expedient to you that I go: for if I go not, the

Paraclete will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he is come, he will convince the world of sin, and of justice, and of judgment. Of sin: because they believed not in me. And of justice: because I go to the Father; and you shall see me no longer. And of judgment: because the prince of this world is already judged. I have yet many things to say to you: but you cannot bear them now. But when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will teach you all truth. For he shall not speak of himself; but what things soever he shall hear, he shall speak; and the things that are to come, he shall shew you. He shall glorify me; because he shall receive of mine, and shall

shew it to you.
