SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Dear faithful,

We hope as many of you as possible will remain after Mass today for the annual **Deanery Corpus Christi Procession**. In better times for our holy faith, the Corpus Christi procession was always a highlight of the liturgical year. Many venerable cities and churches have processions which go back in time to the Middle Ages.

In England, these were suppressed after the Protestant Reformation, but made a great comeback with the revival of the 19th century. Now, before the flood of secularism, the public and joyful profession of faith in our Eucharistic Saviour is an important opportunity to put God back in the public square: "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all things to myself" (John 12:32).

Above all, we believe that Our Lord Jesus Christ Himself has the power to draw men to Himself. Grace converts the hardest of hearts. If we accompany the Saviour in a spirit of faith, we will marvel to see how much is accomplished simply through His Real Presence among us.

TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL Solemnity of Corpus Christi

Lesson from the first letter of St. Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians 1 Cor. 23-29.

Brethren: I myself have received from the Lord - what I also delivered to you, - that the Lord Jesus, on the night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and giving thanks broke, and said, Take and eat. This is My Body which shall be given up for you; do this in remembrance of Me. In like manner also the cup, after He had supped, saying, This is the new covenant in My Blood; do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me. For as often as you shall eat this Bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord, until He comes. Therefore whoever eats this Bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily, will be guilty of the Body and the Blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself, and so let him eat of that Bread and drink of the cup; for he who eats and drinks unworthily, without distinguishing the Body, eats and drinks judgment to himself.

Continuation ♥ of the Holy Gospel according to John John 6:56-59.

At that time, Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews: My Flesh is food indeed, and My Blood is drink indeed. He who eats My Flesh, and drinks My Blood, abides in Me and I in him. As the living Father has sent Me, and as I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also shall live because of Me. This is the Bread that has come down from heaven; not as your fathers ate the manna, and died. He who eats this Bread shall live forever.

Liturgy Corner

Mass and Vespers Coram Sanctissimo
In certain special circumstances, Mass or Vespers may be celebrated before the Blessed Sacrament exposed.

This entails some adjustments to the rubrics. For example, the priest does not turn his back directly to the Blessed Sacrament when he faces the people. At the Orate Fratres and final blessing, he does not complete the full turn at the altar. During the Levabo and incensation, he changes his normal position.

Also, the Blessed Sacrament is incensed prior to the altar.

During the reading of the Last Gospel, instead of making the usual genuflection, the priest kneels toward the Eucharist as he proclaims "Et verbum caro factum est" --and the Word became flesh.
