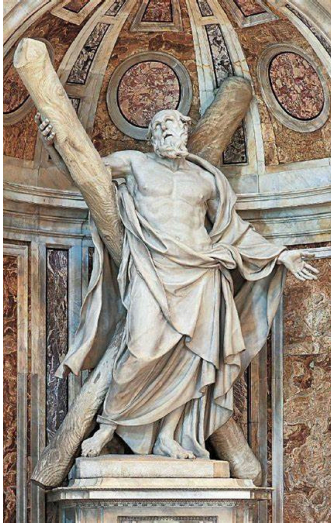

SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER & PAUL

Dear faithful,

“Now therefore you are no more strangers and foreigners; but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and the domestics of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone” (Ephesians 2:19-20).

Throughout the ages, devotion to the Apostles has always been important in Catholic life. Along with Our Lady, St Joseph, St John the Baptist, the Holy Angels and Archangels, Ss. Peter and Paul were constantly invoked by the faithful with confidence. Jesus Christ built the church through these men and Our Lord continues to provide for us through their intercession. We should familiarise ourselves with their lives, such as they appear in the New Testament, and remember to invoke them frequently.

TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL

Solemnity of Ss. Peter & Paul (6th Sunday after Pentecost)

Lesson from the Acts of Apostles

Acts 12:1-11

In those days, Herod the king set hands on certain members of the Church to persecute them. He killed James the brother of John with the sword, and seeing that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also, during the days of the Unleavened Bread. After arresting him he cast him into prison, committing the custody of him to four guards of soldiers, four in each guard, intending to bring him forth to the people after the Passover. So Peter was being kept in the prison; but prayer was being made to God for him by the Church without ceasing. Now when Herod was about to bring him forth, that same night Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and outside the door sentries guarded the prison. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood beside him, and a light shone in the room; and he struck Peter on the side and woke him, saying, Get up quickly. The chains dropped from his hands. And the angel said to him, Gird yourself and put on your sandals. And he did so; and he said to him, Wrap your cloak about you and follow me. And he followed him out, without knowing that what was being done by the angel was real, for he thought he was having a vision. They passed through the first and second guard and came to the iron gate that leads into the city; and this opened to them of its own accord. And they went out, and passed on through one street, and straightway the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself, and he said, Now I know for certain that the Lord has sent His angel and rescued me from the power of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.

Continuation + of the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

Matt 16:13-19

In that time: Jesus came into the quarters of Caesarea Philippi: and he asked his disciples, saying: Whom do men say that the Son of man is? But they said: Some John the Baptist, and other some Elias, and others Jeremias, or one of the prophets. Jesus saith to them: But whom do you say that I am? Simon Peter answered and said: Thou art Christ, the Son of the living God. And Jesus answering, said to him: Blessed art thou, Simon Bar-Jona: because flesh and blood hath not revealed it to thee, but my Father who is in heaven. And I say to thee: That thou art Peter; and upon this rock I will build My Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. And I will give to thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven. And whatsoever thou shalt bind upon earth, it shall be bound also in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose upon earth, it shall be loosed also in heaven.

A Bishop's participation in the liturgy takes different forms according to the circumstances. If a priest is acting as celebrant, the Bishop may assist in choir or from his throne. A celebrating Bishop pontificates either from his throne or using a faldstool (a backless liturgical chair).

The throne is a sign of jurisdiction, meaning that the Bishop has authority over the place in which he celebrates. If he is celebrating outside of his diocese, he must make use of the faldstool.
