Holy Name of Jesus and Epiphany

Dear parishioners and friends of St Walburge's,

As we step into the New Year, Saint Walburge's community gathers to celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, a feast rich with tradition and meaning. Observed on January 6th, the Epiphany commemorates the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles, represented by the Magi who journeyed to Bethlehem, guided by a star.

This feast invites us to reflect on themes of light, guidance, and generosity. The gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh offered by the Magi remind us of the significance of offering our talents and treasures to God and those around us.

Epiphany traditions vary across cultures. In some, chalk is blessed and used to inscribe "20+C+M+B+MMXXV" above doorways, symbolizing the blessing of homes for the year ahead. The letters also stand for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," meaning "May Christ bless this house." In others, special pastries like the "King Cake" are enjoyed, often hiding a token within to crown the finder as the "king" or "queen" for the day. Another cherished tradition is the blessing of Epiphany Water, a powerful

another cherished tradition is the blessing of Epiphany Water, a powerful sacramental used for protection and spiritual renewal. This water is blessed with a special rite invoking the intercession of the Magi and the power of Christ revealed to the nations. Parishioners are encouraged to take Epiphany Water home to bless their families and living spaces, inviting God's grace and peace into their daily lives.

At Saint Walburge's, we encourage all to embrace the spirit of the Epiphany, letting the light of Christ guide our lives and actions. Let us also be inspired by the Magi's journey of faith, seeking Christ in our daily lives and sharing His love with the world.

Wishing you and your families a blessed and joyful Epiphany!

TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL Holy Name of Jesus and Epiphany

Lesson from the Acts of Apostles

Acts 4:8-12

In those days, Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said, Rulers of the people and elders, if we are on trial today about a good work done to a cripple, as to how this man has been cured, be it known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that in the Name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, Whom you crucified, Whom God has raised from the dead, even in this Name does he stand here before you, sound. This is 'The stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone.' Neither is there salvation in any other. For there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.

Gospel

St Luke 2:21

At that time, when eight days were fulfilled for the circumcision of the Child, His name was called Jesus, the name given Him by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.

Lesson from the book of Isaias Isa 60:1-6

Rise up in splendor, O Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears His glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses. Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Madian and Epha; all from Saba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord.

Holy Gospel according to Matthew Matt 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, Magi came from the East to Jerusalem, saying, Where is He that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the east and have come to worship Him. But when King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and so was all Jerusalem with him. And gathering together all the chief priests and Scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. And they said to him, In Bethlehem of Judea; for thus it is written by the prophet, 'And you, Bethlehem, of the land of Juda, are by no means least among the princes of Juda; for from you shall come forth a leader who shall rule My people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the Magi secretly, and carefully ascertained from them the time when the star had appeared to them. And sending them to Bethlehem, he said, Go and make careful inquiry concerning the Child, and when you have found Him, bring me word, that I too may go and worship Him. Now they, having heard the king, went their way. And behold, the star that they had seen in the East went before them, until it came and stood over the place where the Child was. And when they saw the star they rejoiced exceedingly. And entering the house, they found the Child with Mary His Mother, genuflect and falling down they worshipped Him. And opening their treasures they offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another way.
