
FROM THE SPIRE

Tomorrow I will be leaving for a two-week holiday in Royan with my family, and I am very much looking forward to seeing my nieces again—especially them!—as well as a few godchildren.

Today, after the High Mass, I will confer the sacrament of Baptism on Maryrose Elisabeth Lee. May she have a long and holy life as a new Walburgian!

Late this evening, Canon Poucin de Wouilt will return from Torquay. You will be in his care until August 22nd—please take good care of him! I know he will be entirely devoted to you.

I have already begun preparing for the start of the new term. You will find two or three important invitations:

- A catechism series based on the book "La Messe, une forêt de symboles" by Abbé Claude Barthe. This course is open to adults and older teenagers.
- The Eucharistic Crusade of Child Adorers: a monthly prayer initiative for the younger children, held on one Wednesday afternoon each month. We will help the children to pray before the Blessed Sacrament (and sing!), followed by a beautiful story, games, activities, and a snack.
- Guild Sundays will resume at a lighter pace—once a month—since we now offer other opportunities for formation, such as Gregorian chant classes and catechism sessions.

I will soon be sending you a short survey to gather your thoughts regarding the catechism for 11-15-year-olds. I was thinking of holding it one or two Saturdays a month around 4 p.m., but I am eager to hear your suggestions.

Even when I am far from St. Walburge's, I remain close to all of you through a very special prayer for each and every one of you.

I entrust several important intentions to your prayers, Yours in Christ GC+


TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL 8th Sunday after Pentecost

Epistle: Rom 6:19-23

Brethren: I speak in a human way because of the weakness of your flesh; for as you yielded your members as slaves of uncleanness and iniquity unto iniquity, so now yield your members as slaves of justice unto sanctification. For when you were slaves of sin, you were free as regards justice. But what fruit had you then from those things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of these things is death. But now set free from sin and become slaves to God, you have your fruit unto sanctification, and as your end, life everlasting. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is life everlasting in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gospel: Matt 7:15-21

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravenous wolves. By their fruits you will know them. Do men gather grapes from thorns, or figs from thistles? Even so, every good tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Therefore, by their fruits you will know them. Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven; but he who does the will of My Father in heaven shall enter the kingdom of heaven.

Any Catholic may offer up the Mass which he or she attends for any good intention. At Mass you are free to associate your prayer with the intention of the priest, or you are free to offer up participation at the Mass for any number of personal intentions.

Offering a stipend for a Mass intention is a way of contributing to the upkeep of your priests. It is a donation, but our diocese recommends a minimum of £10. If you want to have a Mass offered for a particular intention, you may use the Mass Offering envelope (available in the church porch). Write name(living or deceased) or intention. Enclose donation. Place envelope in collection box or give to a Canon.
