Today the Gospel shows us Our Lord weeping over Jerusalem and her crimes, because she refused to repent herself from her past faults and crimes; because she persecuted the prophets and saints that God, in His merciful bounty sent her, to lead her again upon the right path of salvation.

Eighteen centuries later, Our Lady appeared to two young shepherds in the Alps. She was criying over the sins of men, who didn't not repent even after all the terrible sufferings Her Divine Son endured for them. She said that she could not hold any longer the arm of Her Son who justly desired justice and punishment for these crimes. For sure, all the various wars and calamities we endure since were the fulfilment of God's just wrath against us.

But we can also visibly see that Our Lady's intercession never stopped, and continually protected her children, despite their infidelities. This week, We celebrate the triumph of Our Mother in Heaven, when she received the privilege of being taken to Heaven with Her body and soul, enjoying the eternal reward of the resurrection of the bodies before anyone.

Let's grab the opportunity to praise publicly her in thanksgiving for all the graces of protection she obtained, and will obtain on our behalf from Her Son. We might fear His divine justice; let's go to Her maternal Immaculate Heart, and choose her as our Mother and Mistress. Let's consecrate to Her our body and soul, our goods, both interior and exterior, and even the value of all our good actions, past, present and future; leaving to Her the entire and full right of disposing of us, and all that belongs to us, without exception, according to Her good pleasure, for the greater glory of God in time and in eternity.

TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL 9th Sunday after Pentecost

Epistle: Corinthians 10. 6-13

Brethren, let us not covet evil things, as they also coveted. Neither become ye idolaters, as some of them: as it is written: The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play. Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed fornication, and there fell in one day three and twenty thousand. Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them tempted, and perished by the serpents. Neither do you murmur, as some of them murmured, and were destroyed by the destroyer. Now all these things happened to them in figure, and they are written for our correction, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore he that thinketh himself to stand, let him take heed lest he fall. Let no temptation take hold on you, but such as is human: and God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that which you are able; but will make also with temptation issue, that you may be able to bear it.

Gospel: Luke 19. 41-47

At that time, when Jesus drew near to Jerusalem, seeing the city, He wept over it saying: If thou also hadst known, and that in this day, the things that are to thy peace: but now they are hidden from thy eyes. For the days shall come upon thee, and thy enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and straiten thee on every side; and beat thee flat to the ground, and thy children who are in thee; and they shall not leave in thee a stone upon a stone, because thou hast not known the time of thy visitation. And entering into the temple, He began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought, saying to them: It is written, My house is the house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves. And He was teaching daily in the temple.
