SPIRE IN SUMMER

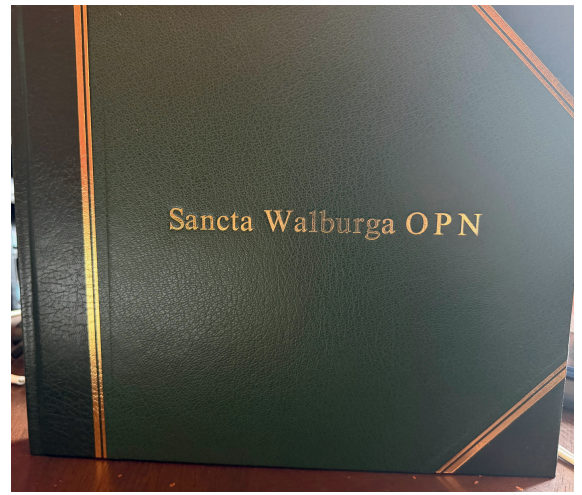

This beautifully crafted volume has been specially commissioned for our church and will accompany the prayer of our Shrine family throughout the year. It is arranged according to the twelve months of the year. Each month, the book will be opened to the corresponding page and displayed in a small display cabinet within the church. The names of those whose anniversaries of death fall during that month will be visible, inviting everyone to remember them in prayer.



Our hope is that this Book of Remembrance will embrace the whole history of St Walburge's: parishioners from the Jesuit years, those from the diocesan parish, and all those who have become part of the life of St Walburge's since the arrival of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest.

Month by month, their names will remind us of one of the greatest spiritual works of mercy: to pray for the dead. Simply pausing to read these names may inspire us to offer an Eternal Rest, a De Profundis, a Rosary, or a Holy Communion for the repose of their souls.

We would now like to ask for your help.

If you would like a family member, a friend, or someone connected with St Walburge's to be included in the Book of Remembrance, please send the following details to the Presbytery:

***The full name of the deceased;**

***The date of death (or at least the month, if the exact date is unknown).**

Their names will then be lovingly entered into the Book so that, year after year, they may be remembered in the prayers of our entire Shrine community. In a world where so much is quickly forgotten, this Book of Remembrance will be a quiet yet profound witness to our Catholic faith. It will be a visible sign of our communion with the invisible Church. As we see these names, we will remember that the Church extends far beyond those gathered in the pews of St Walburge's. She also embraces the Holy Souls in Purgatory, whom our prayers can console and hasten towards the beatific vision of God.

May this Book become a lasting reminder that Christian love does not end at death. One day, we too shall hope to be remembered in the prayers of those who come after us. God bless you, Your Rector

TRANSLATION OF THE EPISTLE AND GOSPEL

Dominica X Post Pentecosten ~ II. classis

Epistle -1 Cor. 12:2-11

Brethren: You know that when you were Gentiles, you went to dumb idols according as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand that no one speaking in the Spirit of God, says Anathema to Jesus. And no one can say Jesus is Lord, except in the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of ministries, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of workings, but the same God, Who works all things in all. Now the manifestation of the Spirit is given to everyone for profit. To one through the Spirit is given the utterance of wisdom; and to another the utterance of knowledge, according to the same Spirit; to another faith, in the same Spirit; to another the gift of healing, in the one Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another the distinguishing of spirits; to another various kinds of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues. But all these things are the work of one and the same Spirit, Who allots to everyone according as He will.

Gospel -Luke 18:9-14

At that time, Jesus spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves as being just and despised others. Two men went up to the temple to pray, the one a Pharisee and the other a publican. The Pharisee stood and began to pray thus within himself: 'O God, I thank You that I am not like the rest of men, robbers, dishonest, adulterers, or even like this publican. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I possess.' But the publican, standing afar off, would not so much as lift up his eyes to heaven, but kept striking his breast, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me the sinner!' I tell you, this man went back to his home justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled, and he who humbles himself shall be exalted.
