Today, on the beautiful feast of All Saints, the Church militant celebrates the glories of the Church triumphant. In the saints the victory of Christ over sin and death throws its invincible light even in the darkest corner of this world.

Tomorrow, we will join the entire Church in its prayer for the dead. All Souls, the day of the commemoration of the dead, reminds us of the Church's work to invoke the mercy of God on behalf of the souls in Purgatory.

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n.1030)

St. Gregory the Great (540-604) is quoted by the catechism in his explanation of the existence of Purgatory: As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come.

As we all know, the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of Mass is the most efficient and fruitful contribution that the Church can make in her efforts to intercede for the dead. Because in each and every Mass Christ Jesus offers Himself as a victim for our sins sacramentally, the celebration of Mass for the deceased is the greatest gift we can make to our beloved ones who left this earth before us. The month of November is dedicated in a special way to this commemoration of the dead, and we invite you to ask us priests to celebrate Masses in this intention: To help those souls in purgatory.

I wish to thank all those who are helping on a regular basis to assure that the pews in the Cathedral are cleaned after every Mass. Our "stewards" are essential in keeping the church open and safe in this tragic time of the pandemic. I ask you very kindly to continue to be generously available for this important work and I wish to ask all faithful to consider to help with sanitizing the church on Sundays and/or weekdays.

In view of a potential extension of the schedule of Masses which are celebrated by the Institute, more helpers are needed to comply with the safety regulations.
