


Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest

Feast of the Chair of Peter - January 18th



The Chair of Saint Peter, located at St. Peter's Basilica, enclosed in a sculpted gilt bronze casing designed by Gian Lorenzo Bernini, 1647-1653.

Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet (1627-1704), the famous French bishop and orator, commented on the divine institution of the papacy in one of his great sermons:

"That which is given as a support of the Church which is to last forever, can never be taken away. Peter will live in his successors; Peter will speak, in his Chair, to the end of time. So speak the Fathers; so speak the six hundred and thirty bishops of the Council of Chalcedon. ... Thus the Roman Church is ever a Virgin-Church; the Faith of Rome is always the Faith of the Church; what has once been believed will be for ever believed; the same voice heard all over the world; and Peter, in his successors, is now, as he was during his life, the foundation on which the Faithful rest. Jesus Christ has

said that it shall be so; and heaven and earth shall pass away rather than this word."

The feast of the Chair of Peter in Rome is an eloquent expression of the Church's gratitude toward its founder with regard to the gift of the papacy. So close to Christmas, this feast celebrates another fruit of the incarnation of God, the coming of God into this world: The visible character of the Kingship of Christ is imprinted on the person of Peter, the Vicar of Christ on earth. And Rome, at the time of Jesus the political, cultural and economic center of the world, was chosen by Divine Providence to be the most effective vessel of a rapid diffusion of the spiritual fruits of the redemption. As St. Leo the Great (Pope from 440 to 461) wrote: "For nothing could be better suited to the divine plan, than the confederation of various kingdoms under one and the same Empire; and the preaching of the gospel to the whole world would the more rapidly be effected by having the several nations united under the government of one common City."

The Institute's superiors were all formed in Rome, and both, our founder and Prior General, Msgr. Gilles Wach, the co-founder and rector of our seminary, Canon Philippe Mora, were ordained to the sacred priesthood by Saint John Paul II. Rome and the Pope in Rome – we canons of the Institute were offered all the graces of having been formed in the same Roman spirit in which our superiors were trained. In Gricigliano, the Institute's seminary, close to Florence and only 170 miles from Rome, we were filled with a deep love and respect for the successor of Peter. Only to Peter Our Lord has said: "Upon thee will I build my Church. To thee I will give the Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven. I prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not; do thou confirm thy brethren ..."



Around the base of the dome inside St. Peter's Basilica is written: TU ES PETRUS ET SUPER HANC PETRAM AEDIFICABO ECCLESIAM MEAM. TIBI DABO CLAVES REGNI CAELORVM - "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church. ... I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven ..." Vulgate, Matthew 16:18–19.
