REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Introit (4 Esdr. 2:34-35)

Eternal rest give to them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. To You we owe our hymn of praise, O God, in Sion; to You must vows be fulfilled in Jerusalem. Hear my prayer; to You all flesh must come. Eternal rest give to them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them.

COLLECT

O God, Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful, grant to the souls of Your servants and handmaids the remission of all their sins, that they may obtain by our loving prayers the forgiveness which they have always desired.

Epistle (2 Mach. 12:43-46)

In those days: The most valiant man Judas, making a gathering, sent twelve thousand drachmas of silver to Jerusalem for sacrifice to be offered for the sins of the dead, thinking well and religiously concerning the resurrection, for if he had not hoped that they that were slain should rise again, it would have seemed superfluous and vain to pray for the dead; and because he considered that they who had fallen asleep with godliness, had great grace laid up for them. It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins.

Gradual (4 Esdr. 2:34-35; Ps 111:7)

Eternal rest give to them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. The just man shall be in everlasting remembrance; an evil report he shall not fear.

TRACTUS

O Lord, absolve the souls of all the faithful departed from every bond of sin. And by the help of Your grace may they be worthy to escape the sentence of vengeance. And to enjoy all the beatitude of the light eternal.

SEQUENTIA DIES IRAE

GOSPEL (JOHN 6:37-40)

At that time, Jesus said to the multitude of the Jews, All that the Father gives to Me shall come to Me, and him who comes to Me I will not cast out. For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him Who sent Me. Now this is the will of Him Who sent Me, the Father, that I should lose nothing of what He has given Me, but that I should raise it up on the last day. For this is the will of My Father Who sent Me, that whoever beholds the Son, and believes in Him, shall have everlasting life, and I will raise him up on the last day.

OFFERTORY

O Lord, Jesus Christ, King of glory, deliver the souls of all the faithful departed from the pains of hell and the deep pit; deliver them from the lion's mouth, that hell engulf them not, nor they fall into darkness, but that Michael, the holy standard-bearer, bring them into the holy light which You once promised to Abraham and his seed.

We offer You, O Lord, sacrifices and prayers of praise; accept them for those souls whom we this day commemorate; grant them, O Lord, to pass from death to the life which You once promised to Abraham and his seed.

SECRET

Look with mercy, we beseech You, O Lord, upon the sacrificial gifts we offer for the souls of Your servants and handmaids, so that, to those upon whom You conferred the merits of Christian faith, You will also grant its reward. Through our Lord.

Communion (4 Esdr. 2:35, 34)

May light eternal shine upon them, O Lord, with Your Saints forever, for You are kind. Grant them eternal rest, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them: with Your Saints forever, for You are kind.

Postcommunion

May the prayer of Your suppliants, O Lord, benefit the souls of Your servants and handmaids, that You may deliver them from all sins and make them sharers in Your redemption.

St. Albert the Great was born c.1200 in Bavaria and died on 15th November 1280 in Cologne. He was a great scholar. His collected writings make up 38 volumes and cover many areas of study, including, theology, philosophy and the sciences. He is a Doctor of the Church and is recognised as patron of natural scientists. St. Thomas Aquinas studied under him. Thomas's fellow students thought Thomas slow, because he was quiet and didn't speak much, but Albert recognised the greatness that Thomas would achieve, saying: "You call him the dumb ox, but in his teaching he will one day produce such a bellowing that it will be heard throughout the world." His feast is on the 15th of November.
