GOSPEL (MATTHEW 22: 1-14)

At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the Pharisees in parables, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying: Tell them that were invited: Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and fatlings are killed, and all things are ready: come ye to the marriage. But they neglected; and went their way, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants: The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good;

and the marriage was filled with guests. And the king went in to see the guests, and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment: and he saith to him: Friend, how camest thou in hither, not having on a wedding garment? but he was silent. Then the king said to the waiters: Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen."

ANNOUNCEMENTS

ST. EDWARD, KING AND CONFESSOR - 13th OCTOBER

King Edward was born in Islip, Oxfordshire between 1002 and 1005 and died in 1066, having reigned from 1042. He built the abbey at Westminster, dedicated to St. Peter. He is the first English king to touch for the "king's evil (Tuberculous lymphadenitis - scrofula). There are many stories telling of his piety and saintliness and the many miracles associated with him. Much venerated, he was canonised by Pope Alexander III in 1161. His feast is kept on the 13th of October, his incorrupt body having been solemnly translated on that day in 1163 by Saint Thomas of Canterbury in the presence of King Henry II.

From The English Martyrologe, by I.W.P. (John Wilson, Priest), Third Edition, MDCLXXII:

'At Westminster by London, the translation of S. Edward, King and Confessor, whose holy body in the ninth year of King Henry the second, was by S. Thomas of Canterbury taken up and put into a costly shrine of silver guilt, and placed in S. Peters Church at Westminster, where also even until our days was kept a Ring of gold, with great veneration, which S. Edward himself had given off his finger to S. John Evangelist, asking Almes in the habit of a poor man, and was after brought to S. Edward from Jerusalem, by a devout Pilgrim, as sent unto him for a token from S. John. This day was afterwards appointed to be kept holy throughout the Realm, by a Councel celebrated at Oxford, in the year of Christ 1222, as also by the Letters Patents of Pope Innocentias the fourth, registred in the Roman Vatican.' [Note: Archaic spelling is used in this quotation.]
