FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT (Ps. 26: 7-9, 1)

Hear O Lord, my voice with which I have cried to Thee: be Thou my helper, forsake me not, nor do Thou despise me, O God, my Savior. **Ps.** The Lord is my light, and my salvation, whom shall I fear? **V** Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

O God, Who hast prepared for those who love Thee such good things as eye hath not seen; pour into our hearts such love towards Thee, that loving Thee above all things, we may obtain Thy promises, which exceed all that we can desire. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE (I PET. 3: 8-15)

Dearly beloved: Be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, being lovers of the brotherhood, merciful, modest, humble; not rendering evil for evil, nor railing for railing, but contrariwise, blessing: for unto this are you called, that you may inherit a blessing. For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile. Let him decline from evil and do good; let him seek after peace, and pursue it; because the eyes of the Lord are upon the just, and His ears unto their prayers, but the countenance of the Lord is against them that do evil things. And who is he that can hurt you, if you be zealous of good? But if also you suffer anything for justice's sake, blessed are ye. And be not afraid of their fear, and be not troubled; but sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts.

GRADUAL (Ps. 83: 10, 9)

Behold, O God our protector, and look on Thy servants. **V** O Lord God of hosts, give ear to the prayers of Thy servants.

ALLELUIA (Ps. 20: 1)

Alleluia, alleluia. **V** In Thy strength, O Lord, the king shall joy; and in Thy salvation he shall rejoice exceedingly. Alleluia.

GOSPEL (Mt. 5: 20-24)

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Except your justice abound more than that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to them of old: Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill, shall be in danger of the judgment. But I say to you, that whosoever is angry with his brother, shall be in danger of the judgment; and whosoever shall say to his brother: Raca, shall be in danger of the council; and whosoever shall say: Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire. If therefore thou offer thy gift at the altar, and there thou remember that thy brother hath anything against thee, leave there thy offering before the altar, and go first to be reconciled to thy brother; and then coming thou shalt offer thy gift.



OFFERTORY (Ps. 15: 7, 8)

I will bless the Lord, who hath given me understanding; I set God always in my sight; for He is at my right hand, that I be not moved.

SECRET

Be appeased, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by our supplications: and in Thy loving kindness, accept the offerings Thy servants and handmaidens lay before Thee, that the offerings of each to the glory of Thy name may profit all alike unto salvation. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION (Ps. 26: 4)

One thing I have asked of the Lord, this will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

POSTCOMMUNION

Thou hast filled us with thy heavenly gifts, O Lord: vouchsafe, we beseech Thee, to cleanse us from our hidden faults, and deliver us from the snares of our enemies. Through our Lord.

Feast of Saints Peter and Paul - 29th June

This feast celebrates the martyrdoms of these two great saints, who both died in Rome. In his History of the Church, Eusebius of Caesarea (260-330), wrote that “When Nero’s power was now firmly established he gave himself up to unholy practices and took up arms against the God of the universe...He was the first of the emperors to be the declared enemy of the worship of Almighty God...So it came about that this man, the first to be heralded as a conspicuous fighter against God, was led on to murder the apostles. It is recorded that in his reign Paul was beheaded in Rome itself, and that Peter likewise was crucified, and the record is confirmed by the fact that the cemeteries there are still called by the names of Peter and Paul, and equally so by a churchman names Gaius, who was living while Zephyrinus was Bishop of Rome.” Gaius wrote “I can point out the monuments of the victorious apostles. If you will go as far as the Vatican or Ostian Way, you will find the monuments of those who founded this church.” He notes that both of them were martyred at the same time, which was also confirmed by Bishop Dionysius of Corinth: “For both of them sowed in our Corinth and taught us jointly: in Italy too they taught jointly in the same city, and were martyred at the same time.”
