Propers of the Mass on January 18th, 2026

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

INTROIT (Ps 65:4, 1, 2)

Let all the earth adore Thee O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Most High. **Ps.** Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise **V** Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God who dost govern all things in heaven and earth, mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace all the days of our life. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE (ROMANS 12: 6-16)

Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth, in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, with honor preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

GRADUAL (PSALM 106: 20-21)

The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. **V** Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men.

ALLELUIA (PSALM 148:2)

Alleluia, alleluia. **V** Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

GOSPEL (JOHN 2:1-11)

At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six water-pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the water-pots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not



whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

OFFERTORY (PSALM 65:1, 2, 16)

Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, all ye that fear God, and I will tell you what great things the Lord hath done for my soul. Alleluia.

SECRET

Sanctify, O Lord, the gifts which we offer, and cleanse us from the stains of our sins. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION (JOHN. 2: 7, 8, 9, 10-11)

The Lord saith: Fill the water pots with water, and carry to the chief steward. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he saith to the bridegroom: Thou hast kept the good wine until now. This first miracle did Jesus in the presence of His disciples.

POSTCOMMUNION

May the operation of Thy power be increased within us; we beseech Thee, O Lord, that being quickened by Thy divine sacraments, we may by Thy bounty, be prepared to receive that which they promise. Through our Lord.

Timothy died around 97 AD and was the first bishop of Ephesus. He was from the city of Lystra or of Derbe, now in Turkey. His mother was Jewish and his father Greek. He met Saint Paul during his second missionary journey and is the person to whom Paul addresses his two epistles to Timothy, calling him "his beloved son in faith." He became Paul's companion and missionary partner along with Silas. **Feast day: 24th January, Mass 10.00am.**

St Timothy as a child, with his grandmother Lois, Willem Drost, 1650s, Hermitage Museum, St Petersburg. Saint Paul writes "Desiring to see thee, being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy, calling to mind that faith which is within thee unfeigned, which also dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and in thy mother Eunice, and I am certain that in thee also." (2 Timothy 1: 4-5)
