

Dear friends of the Institute,

"Peace of heart does not mean that nothing is happening, but that nothing is lacking; it does not lie in suspension of movement, but in having no need to move". (Treatise on the Love of God, book 5, ch. 3).

These few words of our dear Patron Saint of the Institute of Christ the King, St. Francis de Sales, although written 400 years ago, seem to be still applicable to our own epoch. Many people of every times have been seeking wisdom and peace, using all kind of means, spiritualities (even technologies), and many failed.

The reason is twofold: firstly, human nature is limited and we have to accept that God is the Cause, we are merely the effects of His glorious goodness. This first acceptance requires an act of "natural" humility which the devil and our first parents failed to achieve. They did not appreciate enough the generosity of their Creator who granted them human life under His will. This natural gift was precious enough to cause an act of gratitude, and, since they would wisely unite themselves to their own cause, find true peace. Secondly, God is infinitely perfect in His divinity: He wants to share this divine and mysterious life with His intellectual creatures to whom He granted enough potential of comprehension and love in that aim.

At the very heart of these two spiritual faculties, their freedom was vital to make this supernatural union possible. The grace of God is therefore sent to help human nature react the divine intimacy through simple act of humility. This divine help – intervention – in our life is more present and active than we can ever imagine, but it is down to us to welcome it and follow its supernatural direction.

If God is with us every day, who will stand against us?


NEW BRIGHTON



St. Winefride's church, north east of Shrewsbury's centre, continues to attract many faithful from Shrewsbury and beyond. Daily and Sunday Masses, silent Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament twice a week as well as Benediction after Mass on the last Sunday of each month, are appreciated by families and individuals from all walks of life and all age groups. Many faithful come a long way by car, bus or train to attend the liturgical celebrations, especially the Sung Mass on Sundays. Later in November, we had the grace to celebrate the Feast of St John of the Cross for the Nuns of Lanherne and many faithful. Mr. Tocher joined us once again for that occasion alongside a visiting octet called Ottavo, organized by our organist, Paul Mileham. They accompanied the liturgy with William Byrd's Mass for Four Voices, a gem of English sacred polyphony.

In March we were blessed to receive Msgr. Gilles Wach, the Prior General, for the first time. Msgr. received the affiliation of a local priest, Rev. Martin Budge. I wish to extend my thanks here to Fr Budge for his tireless and generous help to our apostolate.

At Easter, a local from the village was received into the Church and we began a monthly meeting for those wanting to explore the Catholic Faith. This informal "Q&A" meeting provides an opportunity to come together to ask varied questions in a relaxed environment.



With an improvement in the weather, the month of May gave us the unique grace to celebrate the 60th wedding anniversary of Val and Bernie Williams, longtime supporters of the Institute, together with their friends and clergy of the Diocese. Several couples also took this opportunity to renew their own marriage vows.



Several weeks later, in June, we received Mgr. R. Michael Schmitz, the Vicar General of the Institute, who kindly celebrated the 10am Sung Mass on the Sunday of his visit to Lanherne.

Last year, thanks to your generosity, and a generous legacy, we managed to completly cover our budget, with a little extra for the coming year.


