Dear friends of the Institute,

"Those who are animated by hope and patience are able to get through the darkest nights¹," these few words of the Pope remind us the great importance of supernatural Hope, which is "the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit²." We easily feel overwhelmed with crosses, sufferings and weaknesses in our own interior life and Faith. The virtue of Hope helps us to believe in Eternal Life and in the promises made to the faithful disciples of our Blessed Lord, as a future accomplishment of our original vocation. This perspective is rather consoling during our pilgrimage on earth, but also should not be considered as limited solely to the life to come.

In the meantime, prefiguring this future reality, Hope places every soul in its very present life: we are not fantasising an eternal happiness in Heaven, our eschatological face-to-face with God, but we are at present living this intimacy in anticipation. Hope therefore is not a virtue looking towards the future, but makes us understand that our future is already in our hands and our life in Christ's Sacred Heart. As Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "it is only when the future is certain as a positive reality that the present also becomes liveable³."

When celebrating the beautiful feast of *Corpus Christi*, we remember that the Real Presence of the Lord in Holy Eucharist is the fountain of Hope: the Blessed Sacrament is

Christ present as well as a "semen gloriæ" (seed of glory). At Communion, our soul is in direct contact with eternal life and indirectly with unending and perfect happiness. These two reasons encourage us to cherish and desire the fruitful reception of Holy Communion, which help us, by the grace of God, realign our life with Heaven.

May the virtue of Hope always stay with us, may the Good Lord dwelling in our souls guide our footsteps to the eternal vision of the Blessed Trinity.

I wish you and your families a blessed month of the Sacred Heart!
